BLOW-UP RESULTS FOR SPACE-TIME FRACTIONAL DYNAMICS

Consider non-linear time-fractional stochastic reaction-diffusion equations of the following type,

$$\partial_t^{\beta} u_t(x) = -\phi(-\Delta)u_t(x) + I_t^{1-\beta} [b(u) + \sigma(u) \stackrel{\cdot}{F} (t, x)]$$

in (d+1) dimensions, where $\beta \in (0,1)$, and the operator ∂_t^{β} is the Caputo fractional derivative while $\phi:(0,\infty)\to(0,\infty)$ is a Bernstein function, and $I_t^{1-\beta}$ is the Riesz fractional integral operator. The forcing noise denoted by F(t,x) is a Gaussian noise. These equations might be used as a model for materials with random thermal memory. We derive non-existence (blow-up) of global random field solutions under some additional conditions, most notably on b, σ and the initial condition. We consider pathwise blow-up and blow up in the moment sense.

These results are our recent joint work with Sunday Asogwa, Chansong Deng, Mohammud Foondun, Wei Liu, and Jebessa Mijena.
