2009-2010 Academic Highlights



The College of Sciences and Mathematics (COSAM) welcomed 781 freshmen this fall for a total of 2,865 undergraduates. Graduate school members totaled 322 to round out an all-time high enrollment of 3,187 in the College. Incoming freshmen boasted an average 3.82 high school GPA, the highest in the University, as well as an average 27.1 ACT score, up from 26.8 in 2008.

Also, 50 percent of COSAM's May 2009 graduates finished with honors. The College's students were accepted to professional schools at 30 percent above the national acceptance rates.


Donald E. Davis Arboretum 2010 Calendar Available


