

## Scholarships

In addition to regular AU academic scholarships which may be applied to study abroad, there are other types of scholarships. General scholarships can be applied to any accredited study abroad program, while many programs such as CEA and IFSA-Butler award program-specific scholarships to encourage students to study on their programs. Be sure to ask the contacts for your study abroad program if it has its own scholarships. Keep in mind that the less-traditional your destination country and course of study, the better chance you may have of obtaining a scholarship. Please see our website for a list of Study Abroad scholarships, and check their websites for application deadlines and requirements. For some of them, you need to start at least a year in advance.
