- Programs in Communication Disorders consistently rank among the Top 50, according to *U.S. News & World Report*. The department has operated a full-service speech and hearing clinic for more than 50 years.
- The Psychological Services Center, a multi-purpose training and research clinic, provides psychological services to children, adolescents, and adults, as well as outreach support for biological sciences research, schools, and other social organizations.
- The Department of Sociology, Anthropology, and Social Work placed more than 120 students in 40 social welfare agencies in the state last year, and engaged anthropology students in a million dollars worth of externally funded research projects over the past three years.
- Political Science students are involved in the election process through the Election Center, the only certificate program for election administration officials in the United States.
- The Department of Communication and Journalism, a fully accredited department, houses the largest number of student majors in the college.
- New course and program offerings in Foreign Languages and Literatures (Asian Studies, International Studies) and new culture courses (Mafia, KungFu, etc.) expose students to cultures and the reality of the a truly global world.
- Several programs in the college are involved with the Homeland Security Initiative, the Child Advocacy Center, AIDS outreach, the Rural Studio, and the Environmental Institute. There are also collaborations with the FBI in research and instruction.
- AU Theatre offers professional-quality performances throughout fall and spring, which are currently free to students.
- The bachelor's program in music lends even more prestige to a department already known for its Auburn University Marching Band, the Auburn University Singers, Steel Band, and Gospel Choir. The college offers music and language courses online to help teachers obtain additional music certification and a foreign languages and literatures master's degree.
- History Professor James Hansen is the author of the best-selling biography, *First Man: The Life of Neil A. Armstrong* (Simon & Schuster, 2005). Author Anne Rivers Siddons, Pulitzer Prize winner Cynthia Tucker and syndicated columnist Rheta Grimsley Johnson are graduates of the College.
- The college's Caroline Marshall Draughon Center for the Arts & Humanities is home to the Alabama Center for the Book, state affiliate of the national Center for the Book in the Library of Congress. The Center annually serves more than 10,000 Alabamians with their outreach programs.
- The College houses the Women's Leadership Institute which provides intensive leadership training to a diverse group of students across all disciplines of study.
