Harrison School of Pharmacy

- The Harrison School of Pharmacy (HSOP) has been a part of Auburn University since 1885.
- The HSOP's program is built on the value of caring as it educates tomorrow's pharmacists.
- Personal character, confidence, and competence are traits of graduates entering practice to assume leadership positions in their communities.
- Student pharmacists continuously care for patients, beginning with their first semester when they are placed on teams with second and third-year students and two faculty members to provide basic pharmaceutical care to community-based patients.
- Students admitted have the following profile:

- The school operates the AU Pharmacy & Pharmaceutical Care Clinic, which offers wellness and medication management for the Auburn/Opelika community to both improve health care outcomes and decrease costs.
- Since 2004, ninety-seven percent of the HSOP graduates have passed their national license exam on the first attempt.
- Since 2006, the HSOP has operated from a new education and clinic wing, which features an active pharmaceutical care clinic and pharmacy, team rooms, and lecture space equipped with the latest technology and electronic medical resources.
- Since 2007, the HSOP has operated a satellite in Mobile located on the University of South Alabama campus allowing for collaboration with students in other health professions and with facilities that replicate those at Auburn.
- The HSOP offers graduate studies (M.S. & Ph.D.) in the various pharmaceutical science disciplines.
