Auburn partners with www.internships.com to bring you around 9,000 listings with over 7000 organizations/companies (large and small, local and international).

Here's how to get started:

- Go to www.internships.com and click on "Students"
- Then, click "Join the Network"
- Select Auburn University from the drop down menu and enter the Promo Code (**ainternships**), and click "Continue"
- Register by entering your First Name, Last Name, Email address, and creating a password
- Finally, click "sign up"
- Confirm email address and password on next page (for security purposes), then click "log in"

INTERNSHIP OVERVIEW

- Available to students of all majors and class levels
- Usually one semester long
- May be paid or voluntary
- May be for class credit depending on your academic department
- Available year-round, usually during the summer or part-time during the school year
- Start searching three to four months in advance, six to eight months for federal positions

FIND AN INTERNSHIP

- **Job Postings:** Search www.jobs.auburn.edu to access internship vacancies.
- **Job Fairs:** Attend special events that put you in direct contact with many potential employers. Events are held both fall and spring semesters and are advertised on our website.
- **Networking:** Discuss your interests with professors, friends and family who can serve as resources. Let them know you are seeking an internship.
- **Web pages:** Be specific when you use the Internet to find positions. Look at professional organization sites, corporate sites and sites that target specific geographic areas.
- **Internal Campaigning:** "Get a foot in the door by working part-time or volunteering. Employers may prefer to hire you for an internship once you have proven your worth at the part-time level.
- **Direct Contact:** You may choose to market yourself to an organization whether openings exist or not. This is done by sending your resume and cover letter directly to the company. Keep in mind that it may take 100 mailings to generate five interviews.

JOBCENTRAL

To register with Auburn's job posting, interview sign-up and resume database software and view available positions, go to www.jobs.auburn.edu and follow the instructions to register and search postings.
