⁷Select from any course at the 3000-level or higher in the College of Agriculture, the College of Business, the College of Sciences and Mathematics, or the School of Forestry and Wildlife, as well as offerings at the 3000 level or better in Sociology, Anthropology, Geography, Political Science or Statistics⁸ Basic Soil Science (AGRN 2040) may also be counted as a professional elective, as may up to 8 hours of a foreign language, regardless of the level. Any course that is used to complete a minor may also be counted as a professional elective. Students are encouraged to plan their professional electives with their advisor around an interest area that best meets their career aspirations.
