## Daily Schedule

### Check In:

Check in at an Auburn University Residential Hall will occur on Sunday, July 19<sup>th</sup> from 5:30pm-6:30pm. A short parent information session will take place at 6:30pm in the dorm lobby. Then campers will enjoy dinner (around 7:00pm) followed by our first nightly activity!

### Closing Ceremony & Check Out:

An informal certificate ceremony will be held at 4:45pm on the last day of camp in Parker Hall room 307. Parents and family members are invited to attend. You may park in the parking deck located at the corner of Duncan Drive and Roosevelt Concourse. Be sure to display the enclosed parking pass to avoid receiving a ticket. The ceremony should conclude no later than 5:30pm. At this time campers will return to the dorms to collect their personal items and check out.

### Residence Halls

#### Directions to the Auburn University Residence Halls:

Due to Auburn University Housing policies, the residence halls will not be assigned until the week before camp. As a result, we will post the actual drop-off point and directions to this location three days prior to camp on our website: [www.auburn.edu/cosam/outreach](http://www.auburn.edu/cosam/outreach) (click on Summer YES under upcoming events, then choose Dorm Assignments on the left-hand side of the page). If you do not have access to the internet you may call, Jesse Daniel three days prior to camp at 334-844-5769 for complete drop-off information.

#### General Information:

All Auburn University Residence Halls are double-occupancy rooms with either a bathroom shared by four campers or access to a community bathroom on the same floor. Dorms are air-conditioned and may get chilly at night.

#### Room Assignments:

Campers will be randomly assigned a roommate of the same age and gender unless a roommate request has been made prior to camp check-in. Males and females may be housed in the same residence hall, but will be placed either on different floors or in different wings of the building. Counselors will be housed in a room on the same floor/wing as the campers. Campers will have 24-hour adult supervision.

### **Quiet Hours:**

Quiet hours are observed from 10:00pm to 7:00am. Students must remain in their dormitory from 10:15pm until 7:15am, except in the case of an emergency.

- Comfortable walking or athletic shoes and clothing that can get dirty (shorts, t-shirts, and tennis shoes).

  - Campers may have the opportunity to visit the AU bookstore to purchase souvenirs.
  - Campers may have the opportunity to visit a local ice cream shop
  - We recommend parents send their campers with no more than \$50.00 of spending money

### **Contacting your Child**

#### **Non-Emergency Contact Information-**

Students will have access to a community phone in the lobby of the dorm. Local calls are free, but long distance calls are not. If your child will need to make long distance calls during camp, please provide them with a method of doing so (calling card, collect call number, cell phone etc.).

#### **Cell Phone Policy-**

All courses are interactive and hands-on. Be aware that campers may take field trips and/or get wet or dirty during activities. Due to the nature of our camps, we do not encourage campers to bring cell phones. However, we understand that parents may feel more comfortable knowing their child is carrying a cell phone. For this reason, cell phones are allowed at all Summer YES Camps. **Campers must turn their cell phones off during all courses throughout the day.** If an emergency situation arises in which you need to immediately get in contact with your child, you may use the emergency contact information (provided below) and a camp representative will get you touch with your child. To contact your child via their personal cell phone you must call them during scheduled relaxation times (see daily schedule). Auburn University is not responsible for cell phones that are lost or stolen during Summer YES Camps.
