Landscape Services receives a national sustainability innovation award

Facilities Management Landscape Services recently received the 2020 APPA Sustainability Innovation Award by implementing the installation of more than 130 self-watering planter pots across campus and converting more than 30 concrete pots to new more efficient self-watering planters.

"The Sustainability Innovation Award is designed to recognize and promote unique and innovative sustainable practices in the educational facilities and campus environments, ultimately embedding them within the educational institution as exemplified by Auburn's landscaping efforts," said Anthony Guerrero, vice president of Member and Community Engagement for APPA.

Facilities Management's Landscape Services Director Justin Sutton noted that the idea came about after the department noticed it was spending a large amount of time watering planter pots across campus. "In an effort to be more sustainable, we searched to find ways to decrease the time spent on this task, while continuing to add color and improve the aesthetics of campus in areas where landscaping was lacking or just not implementable due to the amount of hardscape in specific areas."

The department soon realized that self-watering planters were substantially less labor intensive, which would allow it to dramatically expand use of the planters.

According to Sutton, the benefits soon stretched well beyond what was just visibly appealing.

"We benefited substantially from labor and fuel savings, as well as water conservation and reduced fuel emissions. We believe the benefits directly impacted and improved the Auburn experience by adding splashes of color in more locations across campus while also supporting our go green initiative," Sutton said. "The additional plant material also supports Auburn's Bee Campus USA measures by adding more food sources for pollinators."

Auburn is committed to integrating sustainability into all aspects of the university, including: operations, instruction, research and outreach activities. Auburn considers sustainability a core value and strives for excellence through continuous assessment and improvement.

Landscape Services' additional sustainable initiatives

Landscaping is also using sustainable methods to reduce labor and material costs, water usage and emissions.



Reduce emissions, fuels and noise by using battery operated/electric equipment and vehicles.



Reduce water useage by planting drought tolerant/xeriscape plants that do not require a lot of maintenance.



Reduce dependency on gas by using manual loppers to prune plants and trees.



Reduce pinestraw applications by re-coloring existing pinestraw with a nontoxic water-based dye to give it a "like new" look.



Reduce water useage by utilizing Smart Irrigation controllers to provide water-saving benefits including moisture sensors, water flow sensing and weather based scheduling.



Recycle grass clippings, flowers, leaves, etc. into composted soil which is then used in new landscape planting projects.



Re-use flower containers and trays in the greenhouse. Plastic containers Landscaping doesn't use are returned to growers for re-use.



75% of fertilizer usage is eco-friendly ones that include bio-solids. Much of the fertilizers used across campus on the turf and landscape contain 35% bio-solids.



Focus on using more native plants and trees to pursue eradication of invasive plant species on campus.
