Thank you for bringing the holidays to campus!

"Take a look at this picture," said a passerby as she stopped to take a photo with the Auburn University Christmas tree. "I think it turned out great. I like seeing Samford Hall in the background."

The story behind this "selfieworthy" holiday campus location dates back to 2007 when Landscape Services Supervisor John Vollor and his team planted a 10-foot-tall Green Giant Arborvitae on Samford lawn so that it could easily be seen from South College Street.

Today, the now 30-foot-tall tree has become the official Auburn University Christmas tree.

Who are the elves that bring this Auburn tradition to life each year?

To find out, let's take a walk down memory lane.

In 2002, Landscape Services Supervisor Glenn Rodgers and his team began decorating a large Holly tree at the northeast corner of Samford Hall. In 2006, a pre-cut tree was the decorated.

Glenn's team continued to decorate the tree until 2013 when Chris Channell, Brittany Foster and Anthony Smith took over and managed the decorations until 2018.

SGA sponsored the tree and provided lights and orange and blue bows until 2015 when Facilities took over the entire responsibility.

Interesting fact, from 2016–18 the same decorations were used each year. From 2019 to the present, the tree's holiday décor has changed each year.

"When the ornaments are taken down, Brittany Foster counts and inventories what is still usable for the next year," said Justin Sutton, director of Landscape Services. "Usually around July, Brittany, Cory Akers and I begin discussing décor options. Once a plan is in place, decorations are purchased. Sometimes the plan changes a bit based on product availability."
