## Calendar Information Item

Currently the Senate has a resolution that the calendar will consist of no fewer than 75 class days in a semester with the equivalent days in the summer.

There are problems with the length of the semester as there are many other constraints:

- 1. Five six days of exams. (With five day exam period, there are overlapping exams causing major problems for faculty rescheduling exams.)
- 2. Usually the calendar allows at least one reading day between classes and final exams.
- 3. Two days are needed for faculty to grade exams before graduation. (In Spring 09, only one day caused huge problems for faculty, advisors and registrar's office.)
- 4. At least one day (not graduation day) is needed with administrative offices open after grades are due for students to see advisors, dept chairs and hopefully faculty.
- 5. Nine days are needed between semesters
  - a. For registrar's office
    - i. To process grades for Academic action (warning, suspension) and letters to be sent.
    - ii. To check prerequisites for the next semester.
    - iii. To check scholarship requirements.
  - b. For students:
    - i. For GAPing of classes.
    - ii. For academic appeals.
    - iii. So move in day in summer does not overlap with graduation day (Summer 09).
- 6. Other considerations for faculty:
  - a. Some colleges do international trips with students between semesters and need a longer break.
  - b. Faculty use the breaks between semesters to work on research and prepare for the new semesters.
  - c. Time is needed to prepare websites and consult with IT on Blackboard, etc prior to the semester.

Reasons for seventy five class days: faculty feel they need that much time to preserve the academic integrity of the classes.

- 1. University of Georgia and Alabama both have seventy five class days in a semester.
- 2. However, there are many schools with excellent reputations with shorter semesters.

To preserve 75 class days and allow adequate time between semesters, we can gain days by eliminating days off:

- 1. No days off for Labor Day, Memorial Day, Martin Luther King Jr Day, and July 4<sup>th</sup> if it is on a holiday. (Staff and AP would probably not work on a class day if we do this.)
- 2. Shorter Thanksgiving Break to only Thursday and Friday. (Note: students asked for a Fall break, and were told Thanksgiving served as Fall break.)
- 3. Shorten the December Holiday break and Spring break. (Note: I don't believe students would respond well to either of these choices.)
- 4. Eliminate exam days for first summer session (but some colleges need at least 10 weeks in the summer.)
