Freshman Enrollment Guide





Welcome to the Class of 2028.

Congratulations! You have been admitted into a nationally ranked institution that will open up a world of possibilities. This information will guide you through the next steps in the enrollment process.

Finalizing Your Admission

To confirm your place at Auburn University, you must complete all of the following by the deadlines given below:

1 Activate your Auburn user account.

Visit auburn.edu/activate for instructions to enable your Auburn account. Once your account is activated, you will be able to log in to AU Access. You will also be able to log in to your Auburn email account, which will be the official form of communication from Auburn University. It is important to activate your account first as you will need access to these tools to complete your admission acceptance.

2 Confirm your enrollment.

You must submit your enrollment deposit or "Intent to Enroll" form by the following dates:

Summer term – May 1

Fall term – May 1

Spring term – December 1

Submit your \$250 enrollment deposit or "Intent to Enroll" form online via your Auburn Admitted Portal at aub.ie/admittedportal. This deposit is non-refundable and will be applied toward your first semester tuition and orientation fees. Charges incurred prior to registration will be billed separately and should be paid accordingly. All students are required to pay the enrollment deposit, including pre-paid tuition participants and athletic scholarship recipients. If you are accepted after the deposit deadline, you have 15 days from your acceptance date to submit your enrollment deposit. This is not a deposit for university housing.

3 Register your phone with Duo 2-factor authentication.

Register your device with Duo 2-factor authentication, Auburn's mobile security system, by visiting duo.auburn.edu. Students accepted to Auburn will be required to use Duo to access their email, complete CWE registration, register for classes, as well as to access other Auburn resources from both on- and off-campus. Please remember Duo provides a connection to Auburn resources for the student, so the device registered should be the student's device — not a parent's device.

4 Register for Camp War Eagle.

Deadline: June 1

Your enrollment deposit must be received to register for Camp War Eagle (CWE). Please note that this is different from your housing deposit. CWE registration is expected to open in mid-March.

5 Verify we have received your official final high school transcript.

Log into your Auburn Admitted Portal at aub.ie/admittedportal to verify we have received an official copy of your final high school transcript before the first day of class. If we do not receive your official final high school transcript by the first day of fall classes, a hold will be placed on your account.



Student Housing

Are you looking for a convenient, supportive environment and the chance to develop lasting friendships? On-campus living is for you. With various housing options to choose from, living on campus has something for every student and will be your home away from home while at Auburn.

Living on campus allows you to take advantage of programs, activities and leadership opportunities right where you live. Visit auburn.edu/housing for more information.

IMPORTANT NOTES

The housing application will open in November. Students will receive an email to their Auburn email with a time slot to apply for housing. We encourage students to apply for housing as soon as they can to increase their chance of selecting their desired housing community.

On-campus housing for freshmen is limited. Incoming freshmen are not required to live on campus. We house approximately 65% of our freshman class in on-campus housing and utilize a standby list once housing applications exceed capacity.

Your enrollment deposit is NOT a deposit for housing.

Housing requires a non-refundable application fee when you submit your application as well as an assignment confirmation pre-payment to confirm your on-campus housing assignment.

Cancellation of housing does NOT imply cancellation of admission.

Orientation

Camp War Eagle (CWE) is Auburn's orientation program for incoming freshmen and their families. While at CWE, you will connect with other students and learn more about some of the university resources available to you. Students will also meet their CWE counselor, a current Auburn student, who will help prepare them for success. Registration for CWE is expected to open in mid-March for students who have submitted their enrollment deposit. The deadline to register is June 1. For more information, please visit auburn.edu/cwe.

SPRING TERM FRESHMEN

Watch your Auburn email for more information about being added to the new student modules. These modules will help prepare you to register for classes. You will also be invited to attend a Successfully Orienting Students (SOS) orientation session.



Scholarships and Financial Aid

SCHOLARSHIPS

Following acceptance, first-year students must complete the scholarship application through the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) by February 15 for general and departmental scholarship consideration. First-year students are not required to submit the enrollment deposit to apply for scholarships and are only required to complete the scholarship application once each academic year. To complete the scholarship application and search for scholarships, visit AUSOM on Admitted Students or My Finances in AU Access. A scholarship application is not required for consideration of competitive merit scholarships or select need-based scholarships.

First-year student scholarships are awarded competitively for four years among eligible incoming students who enroll summer or fall

immediately following high school graduation. Competitive merit scholarships require a minimum GPA and test score for consideration.

To receive consideration for need-based scholarships, students should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)*, available in December at studentaid.gov/fafsa. Need-based scholarships will be awarded to first-year students by late March. Students selected for FAFSA verification will not be eligible for financial aid, including need-based scholarships, if that process is incomplete. The FAFSA, and other requirements if necessary, should be received by February 15 for consideration of all need-based scholarships.

FINANCIAL AID

More than 60% of Auburn students receive some type of financial assistance. Students interested in receiving financial aid should complete the FAFSA*, available in December at studentaid.gov/fafsa.

Medical Form

A medical information form must be submitted online prior to your enrollment at Auburn. Go to auburn.edu/medicalform to find out more about the medical requirements. If you have questions concerning the form, please call the Auburn Medical Clinic at 334-844-4416.

*The FAFSA is the only form a student is required to complete to be considered for student assistance from any of the Title IV HEA programs, except for information needed to ensure the student's eligibility for such assistance (e.g., information needed to complete verification or to demonstrate compliance with the student eligibility provisions of the HEA and the regulations). Additional information, if requested, will be listed on the student's AU Access My Finances page after results of the FAFSA are received. For additional information, visit auburn.edu/finaid.

**The Department of Education has planned significant changes to the 2024-2025 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which has resulted in a known delay in availability of the FAFSA from October to December 2023. To ensure students have sufficient time to complete the FAFSA and provide additional documentation if selected for verification, Auburn University is adjusting its timeline for consideration and notification of need-based aid, including scholarships, for the 2023-2024 academic year. The scholarship deadline will be February 15 for 2024-25 consideration and will return to February 1 for 2025-26 consideration. All dates and deadlines have been updated accordingly on the University Scholarships website.

ALEKS Math Placement Assessment

ALEKS Math Placement Assessment ALEKS PPL is a Math Placement Assessment taken prior to participating in summer orientation to determine your first math course to be taken at Auburn. Once you have submitted your enrollment deposit, you can access ALEKS in AU Access to take the initial assessment. You can choose to take the assessment up to three times for the opportunity to improve your math placement. Students who have already completed a college level math course or earned college math credit through an AP or IB test score are not required to take ALEKS but are encouraged to do so to confirm their placement or try to place into a higher math course.
