Transfer Enrollment Guide



Welcome to Auburn

Congratulations! You have been admitted into a nationally ranked institution that will open up a world of possibilities. This information will guide you through the next steps in the enrollment process.

Finalizing Your Admission

To confirm your place at Auburn University, you must complete all of the following by the deadlines given below:

1

Activate your Auburn user account.

Visit auburn.edu/activate for instructions to enable your Auburn account. Once your account is activated, you will be able to log in to AU Access. You will also be able to log in to your Auburn email account, which will be the official form of communication from Auburn University. It is important to activate your account first as you will need access to these tools to complete your admission acceptance.

2

Confirm your enrollment.

You must submit your enrollment deposit or “Intent to Enroll” form by the following dates:

Summer term – June 1

Fall term – August 1

Spring term – December 1

Submit your enrollment deposit or “Intent to Enroll” form online via your Auburn Admitted Portal at aub.ie/admittedportal. This deposit is non-refundable and will be applied toward your first semester tuition and orientation fees. Charges incurred prior to registration will be billed separately and should be paid accordingly. All students are required to pay the enrollment deposit, including pre-paid tuition participants and athletic scholarship recipients. If you are accepted after the deposit deadline, you have 15 days from your acceptance date to submit your enrollment deposit. This is not a deposit for university housing.

3

Complete your new student modules.

Watch your Auburn email for more information about being added to the new student modules. These modules will help you complete your transfer plan of study and prepare you to register for classes when your registration time ticket opens in November (for spring) and April (for summer/fall). You will want to complete the modules as soon as possible so your academic advisor can begin reviewing your information. Visit auburn.edu/sos for more information.

4

Register for classes.

In order to be cleared to register for classes, you must submit your enrollment deposit and complete the new student modules (including the transfer plan of study). After your academic advisor has reviewed your information, you will receive suggested classes to take your first semester. More information about when and how to register will be provided in the new student modules.

5

Register for orientation. (Successfully Orienting Students)

Visit auburn.edu/sos for the most up-to-date information about your orientation session, including session dates and schedules. You must attend orientation to keep your class schedule. To register for SOS, you must submit the \$250 enrollment deposit. Students may attend SOS without completing the modules, but will not be able to register for classes until they complete the modules and submit the transfer plan of study.

New Student Modules

These modules provide you with key information prior to your orientation session and help facilitate communication with your academic advisor. Class registration is assigned by specific time tickets based on the number of hours you have completed. For spring semester, registration time tickets open in the beginning of November and for summer and fall semesters, registration time tickets open in the beginning of April. Aim to pay your enrollment deposit and complete the new student modules by October 15 (for spring) and March 15 (for summer/fall) so you can be ready once time tickets open. We encourage you to complete the modules as soon as possible because the longer you wait, the fewer class opportunities will be available.

It will take time for your academic advisor to review your information and send your suggested classes after you complete the modules. If you complete the modules after the suggested dates above, it may take your academic advisor longer due to the increased demand during the registration period. Please allow at least 10 business days after completing your modules for your academic advisor to review your information.



Orientation

Successfully Orienting Students (SOS)

SOS is a one-day orientation program for transfer students. Led by Auburn student leaders, the program emphasizes campus life, services and initiates small group discussions about college life at Auburn. Visit auburn.edu/sos or call 334-844-4501 for more information.

You must attend SOS to keep your class schedule.



Scholarship and Financial Aid

Scholarships

Following acceptance, incoming transfer students must complete the scholarship application through the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) by February 15 to receive consideration for general and departmental scholarships.

Incoming students are not required to submit the enrollment deposit to apply for scholarships and are only required to complete the scholarship application once each academic year. To complete the scholarship application and search for scholarships, visit AUSOM on Admitted Students or My Finances in AU Access.

To receive consideration for need-based scholarships, students should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)*, available in December at studentaid.gov/fafsa. Need-based scholarships will be awarded to incoming transfer students in late March. Students selected for FAFSA verification will not be eligible for financial aid, including need-based scholarships, if that process is incomplete. The FAFSA, and other requirements if

necessary, should be received by February 15 for consideration of all need-based scholarships.

Financial Aid

More than 60% of Auburn students receive some type of financial assistance. Students interested in receiving financial aid should complete the FAFSA*, available in December at studentaid.gov/fafsa.

*The FAFSA is the only form a student is required to complete to be considered for student assistance from any of the Title IV HEA programs, except for information needed to ensure the student's eligibility for such assistance (e.g., information needed to complete verification or to demonstrate compliance with the student eligibility provisions of the HEA and the regulations). Additional information, if requested, will be listed on the student's AU Access My Finances page after results of the FAFSA are received. For additional information, visit auburn.edu/finaid.

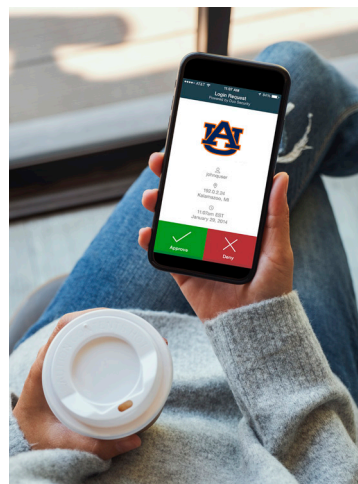
**The Department of Education has planned significant changes to the 2024-2025 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which has resulted in a known delay in availability of the FAFSA from October to December 2023. To ensure students have sufficient time to complete the FAFSA and provide additional documentation if selected for verification, Auburn University is adjusting its timeline for consideration and notification of need-based aid, including scholarships, for the 2023-2024 academic year. The scholarship deadline will be February 15 for 2024-25 consideration and will return to February 1 for 2025-26 consideration. All dates and deadlines have been updated accordingly on the University Scholarships website.



Student Housing

At Auburn, students are not required to live on campus. If you are interested in on-campus housing, apply early to optimize your chance to live in your preferred housing option.

Register for Duo

Duo is a 2-factor authentication tool which requires the student to provide login credentials AND proof of identity via a second device, such as a smart phone or tablet, before granting you access to an online resource. Students accepted to Auburn will be required to use Duo to access their email, complete SOS registration, register for classes, as well as access other Auburn resources from both on- and off-campus. Visit duo.auburn.edu to register your device. Please remember that Duo provides a connection to Auburn resources for the student, so the device registered should be the student's device — not a parent's device.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

You cannot register for classes until you have paid your enrollment deposit, submitted your plan of study and completed your pre-orientation modules.

You cannot register for SOS until your enrollment deposit has been received and you have submitted your plan of study.

If you want to live on campus, visit the housing website at auburn.edu/housing to apply.

You must attend SOS to keep your registered class schedule.

- Activate your Auburn student account at auburn.edu/activate for access to your Auburn email and AU Access.
- Submit your \$250 enrollment deposit or “Intent to Enroll” form within the Auburn Admitted Portal.
- Complete the new student modules and submit your plan of study within AU Access.
- Complete your scholarship application through the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) within AU Access by February 15 for general and departmental scholarship consideration.
- Complete the FAFSA at studentaid.gov/fafsa by February 15 for need-based scholarship consideration and by late March for consideration of other financial aid.
- Register for SOS.
- Have your postsecondary institution(s) send your final transcript(s) for possible transfer credit.
- Accept scholarships in AUSOM and financial aid awards through My Finances in AU Access.
- Submit the required medical form online at auburn.edu/medicalform.
- Active duty and veteran service personnel are encouraged to contact the Education Service Office (ESO) within their respective military service prior to enrolling.
- Enjoy your time at SOS and get ready for an exciting time on the Plains!
