Freshman Enrollment Guide

THIS IS AUBURN.

Congratulations on your acceptance! You have been admitted into a top-ranked institution that will open up a world of opportunities. You'll be hearing more from us over the next few months, but this information will explain what happens now and what you need to do next in the enrollment process.

Finalizing Your Admission

To confirm your place in the freshman class, you must complete all of the following by the deadlines given below:

1 Activate your Auburn User account.

Visit auburn.edu/activate for instructions to enable your Auburn account. Once your account is activated, you will be able to log in to AU Access – your Auburn account portal. You will also be able to log in to Tigermail (your Auburn email account) which will be the official form of communication from Auburn offices. It is important to activate your account first in this process, as you will need access to these tools to complete your admission acceptance.

2 Submit your \$200 Confirmation Deposit.

Deadline: Summer term - May 1
Fall term - May 1
Spring term - November 1

Submit your confirmation deposit online via AU Access or visit auburn.edu/admissions/deposit. This deposit is non-refundable and will apply to your first semester tuition and orientation fees. All students are required to pay the confirmation deposit including PACT participants and academic or athletic scholarship recipients. If you are accepted after the deposit deadline, you have 30 days from your acceptance date to submit your confirmation deposit.

3 Register for Camp War Eagle orientation.

Deadline: June 1

Your confirmation deposit must be received to register for Camp War Eagle. Beginning in March, The First Year Experience Office will mail registration information to students who have submitted their confirmation deposit.

Freshmen entering in Auburn's spring term must attend SOS (Successfully Orienting Students) rather than Camp War Eagle.

4 Send the final copy of your high school transcript.

Upon graduation, request a final copy of your high school transcript be sent to:

Student Housing

Want convenience, a supportive environment, and the chance to develop lasting friendships? Then live on campus! The Hill, Quad, Village, South Donahue, and Cambridge residential areas at Auburn are your "home away from home."

You'll also be able to take advantage of programs, activities, and leadership opportunities right where you live. Visit auburn.edu/housing for more information about living on campus.

At Auburn, freshmen are not required to live on campus. If you prefer to reside off campus, find the latest information about off-campus housing options at offcampushousing.auburn.edu.

- On-campus housing for freshmen is limited.

If you consider living on campus to be an integral part of your overall college experience, apply for housing as soon as possible to guarantee your spot and to optimize your chance of being placed in your preferred housing option. Though incoming freshmen are not required to live on campus, we currently accommodate approximately 65% of our freshman class in on-campus housing. We do not guarantee on-campus housing and will initiate a waiting list when the number of housing applications exceeds capacity.

- The housing application will be available once your \$200 confirmation deposit has been received.

University Housing will provide additional information regarding on-campus housing after your confirmation deposit has been received.

- Your confirmation deposit is NOT a deposit for housing.

A separate housing pre-payment must be submitted with your housing application. Cancellation of housing does NOT imply cancellation of admission.



Orientation

Camp War Eagle

Camp War Eagle is Auburn's award-winning freshman orientation program. Incoming freshmen and their parents or guests travel to Auburn for a two-day, one-night intensive training session on "Life as an Auburn Tiger." You'll learn about academic programs and services, campus life, and Auburn traditions. You will also register for your classes during Camp War Eagle. Best of all, Camp War Eagle counselors are current Auburn students and can prepare you for success as a new student. Parents will attend a program designed just for them, and they'll have the opportunity to meet with various offices on campus.

Successfully Orienting Students

Freshmen accepted for spring term will attend SOS orientation in the fall.

- You cannot register for Camp War Eagle or SOS orientation until your confirmation deposit has been received.

Orientation materials will be mailed to students who have submitted their confirmation deposit beginning in March.

- Deadline for registration is June 1st.

Scholarships & Financial Aid

Scholarships

Auburn provides a variety of scholarships to eligible students through the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM). Students should complete the scholarship application through AUSOM by 4:45 p.m. CST December 1 to receive priority consideration for Freshman Scholarships and must complete the scholarship application through AUSOM by 4:45 p.m. CST February 10 to receive final consideration for available Freshman Scholarships, as well as General Scholarships and Departmental Scholarships.

Incoming students are not required to submit the confirmation deposit to apply for scholarships and are only required to complete the scholarship application once each academic year. To complete the scholarship application and search for scholarships, visit AUSOM on Admitted Students or My Finances in AU Access.

Students should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)*, available online beginning October 1. The FAFSA must be received by Auburn University by March 1 for consideration of financial aid, including need-based scholarships.

Financial Aid

More than 60% of Auburn students receive some type of financial assistance. The FAFSA* is available online beginning October 1 and should be received by Auburn University by March 1 for consideration of financial aid, including need-based scholarships. Types of financial aid available include grants, loans, and work-study programs.

*The FAFSA is the only form a student is required to complete to be considered for student assistance from any of the Title IV HEA programs, except for information needed to ensure the student's eligibility for such assistance (e.g., information needed to complete verification or to demonstrate compliance with the student eligibility provisions of the HEA and the regulations). Additional information, if requested, will be listed on the student's AU Access My Finances page after we receive the results of the FAFSA. For additional information, visit auburn.edu/finaid.
