EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT for GOVERNMENT and the PUBLIC SECTOR

This certificate program in Emergency Management uses the convenience of online learning. It is designed to meet the specialized needs of:

- Governmental managers and leaders
- Elected officials
- Individuals employed by governmental entities
- Individuals employed in the public sector

Courses Offered

Four core courses and one elective course are required for completion of the *Emergency Management Certificate Program*.

The core courses required for certification are:

- Planning and Preparation
- Resource Management
- Unmet Needs and Challenges
- The Roles of Local Governments in Recovery Processes

Courses available for elective credit include:

- Mitigation and Planning for Local Governments
- Managing Donations and Finances Surrounding Disasters
- Tools for Assessment and Structural Capacity
- Information Technology and Disasters

Requirements

A certificate in Emergency Management is earned by completing a minimum of five (5) courses. Individuals enrolled in the Emergency Management Certificate Program must complete all of the four specified core courses as well as one of the elective courses.

Format

You can accomplish certification through completion of the program which is provided exclusively online. Emergency Management courses are designed to be accessible to professionals throughout the United States through distance learning formats.

Schedule

Each course will be conducted online during a 4-week time frame.

Registration Cost

Each course costs \$400 per registrant. The course fee does not include the cost of required text books.
