Fuster has made a major contribution over 10 years of work of rebuilding and decorating the fishing town of Jaimanitas in the outskirts of Havana, where he lives. Jaimanitas is now a unique work of publi art where Fuster has decorated over 80 houses with ornate murals and domes to suit the personality of his neighbors, he



has built a chess park with giant boards and tables, The Artists' Wall composed of a quilt of dozens of tiles signed and donated by other Cuban artists, a theatre and public swimming pools.

11:00 am – Short Panoramic City Bus Excursion to the Revolution Square

The **Revolution Square** is a public square in the city of Havana, one of the largest in the world with 72 thousand square meters. In it we find the Monument to Jose Marti sculpted by Juan Jose Sicre and facing each other have the Interior Ministry



with the famous image of Che Guevara taken by photographer Korda made a sculptural relief work of Enrique Avila. In 2009 the work (the same artist and technical specifications) opened to Camilo Cienfuegos, another great hero of the Cuban Revolution.

12:00 pm- Lunch at Paladar La Guarida

Find an exclusive atmosphere inside this splendid edifice from the early 20th century. La Guarida is considered by many to be one of the best paladars in all of Cuba

3:00 pm Check-in at Hotel Nacional and Exchange Your Currency

The Hotel Nacional de Cuba is considered a symbol of history, culture and Cuban identity. The guns that made up the old Santa Clara Battery are on exhibition at the garden, they were declared part of the World Heritage Site. The Hotel Nacional de Cuba was declared a National Monument and it was inscribed in the World Memory Register. With its privileged location in the middle of Vedado,



the center of Havana, it stands on a hill just a few meters from the sea, and offers a great view of the Havana Harbor; the seawall and the city.

The Hotel stands out due to its refined elegance and its ancient splendor, which since 1930 has attracted a large number of personalities from the arts, science and politics, such as British Prime Minister Winston Churchill, artists Frank Sinatra, Ava Gardner, Johnny Weissmuller, Maria Félix, Jorge Negrete, Rick Cook, and scientist Alexander Fleming.

- Plaza de la Revolución Conceived by French urbanist Jean Claude Forestier in the 1920s, the gigantic Plaza de la Revolución (known as Plaza Cívica until 1959) was part of Havana's 'new city,' which grew up between 1920 and 1959.



- Cementerio de Cristóbal Colón Also known as Christopher Columbus Cemetery, this is one of the great historical cemeteries of the world, and is very important in Latin American history.
- Parque Almendares This park runs along the banks of the city's Río Almendares, below the bridge on Calle 23.



- Enjoy cocktails at La Terrazas Bar and Restaurant; a place related to the life of the famous writer and to Gregorio Fuentes, the captain of his fishing boat.

Optional Late Evening - The Bar Floridita

Opened in the early 19th century and still preserving much of the atmosphere of the 1940s and 1950s, with the red coats of the bartenders matching the regency style decoration that dates from the 1959. The Nobel prizewinning American writer Ernest Hemingway frequented the bar and made it his favorite. The establishment today



contains many noticeable memorabilia of the author, and a life- size bronze statue at the end of the bar, sculpted by the Cuban artist Jose Villa Soberon.
