

FACULTY MENTORING PROGRAM OVERVIEW

II. Method:

- A. During an academic year, a new faculty member (mentee) will pair with a successful and experienced colleague who is willing to serve as a mentor and consultant.
- B. It is the responsibility of the mentee to enlist the collaboration of an experienced colleague mentor to participate in this program;
 1. The mentor may be an experienced colleague from on or off campus who has a record of successful funding;
 2. The mentor cannot be either a former major professor or postdoctoral advisor to the mentee;
 3. The mentor and the mentee may be members of a research group. This group may participate in the proposal; however, the proposal must be the primary product of the mentor/mentee team with the mentee as principal investigator;
 4. The mentor's credentials and strength of commitment to serve in this capacity (as stated in the mentor's letter of commitment) will be important evaluation factors.
