

## FACULTY MENTORING PROGRAM OVERVIEW

### V. Requirements:

- A. A plan of work that describes the proposed project is required as stated in the "Faculty Mentoring Proposal Instructions" on this web page;
- B. A progress report is due November 1, 2008;
- C. The Final Report required at the end of the project is to be accompanied by one of the following items:
  - 1. A proposal to an external funding agency;
  - 2. If another outcome was identified in the proposal such as a publication or other scholarly and creative work, a final report will be submitted to the OVPR fully reporting this accomplishment;
- D. The Faculty Mentoring Committee comprises award recipients from the previous program year;
  - 1. Awardees of the 2007/2008 program year will become the committee members of the 2008/2009 and 2009/2010 program years;
  - 2. The benefits of this practice are three fold;
    - a. Gives junior faculty the opportunity to bring fresh insights from their faculty mentoring experience to the program;
    - b. Gives junior faculty practical experience of being on the "other side" of the proposal

- selection process;
- c. Fosters healthy intercollegiate competition: the more faculty members from a particular college/school represented in the committee is a direct result of the previous year's competition.
3. Committee members who are currently collaborating with either a P.I. or a mentor can serve on the committee. However, they must recuse themselves from reviewing/scoring the proposal and excuse themselves from the discussion of the proposal during the selection committee meeting.
