



2010-2011 Non-Resident Freshman Scholarships

Academic Scholarships

- ❖ A number of four-year, renewable scholarships are awarded at three levels in December among non-resident students with a minimum 28 ACT or 1250 SAT score and a 3.25 high school GPA. Students must have the minimum test score and high school GPA required for consideration at each level. Competition for these scholarships is keen, and consideration does not guarantee that a scholarship will be awarded.
- ❖ **Presidential Scholarship**
 - Requires a 33-36 ACT (1440-1600 SAT) score and a minimum 3.75 high school GPA.
 - Awarded non-resident tuition for four years; a \$1,500 technology allowance in the first fall semester; and the Auburn Academic Guarantee, which includes automatic admission to the Honors College and an enrichment experience valued at \$4,000 after the second year.
- ❖ **Heritage Scholarship**
 - Requires a 30-32 ACT (1330-1430 SAT) score and a minimum 3.5 high school GPA, or a 33-36 ACT (1440-1600 SAT) score and a 3.50-3.74 high school GPA.
 - Awarded 2/3 non-resident tuition for four years.
- ❖ **Charter Scholarship**
 - Requires a 28-29 ACT (1250-1320 SAT) score and a minimum 3.25 high school GPA, or a 30-36 ACT (1330-1600 SAT) score and a 3.25-3.49 high school GPA.
 - Awarded \$14,000 over four years (\$3,500 per year).

National Scholars

- ❖ National Merit Finalists, National Achievement Finalists, and National Hispanic Scholars receive:
 - Academic Presidential Scholarship, replacing an Academic Heritage or Charter Scholarship if previously awarded;
 - On-campus housing allowance for four years; and
 - \$4,000-\$8,000 stipend over four years (\$1,000-\$2,000 per year), depending on eligibility as determined by National Merit Scholarship Corporation and/or financial need as determined through completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- ❖ National Merit Finalists must name AU as their first choice institution with National Merit Scholarship Corporation by their requested deadline(s). National Achievement Finalists and National Hispanic Scholars should mail or fax a copy of their notification letter to the Office of University Scholarships.

Elite Scholarships

- ❖ Require a minimum 34 ACT or 1490 SAT score and a 3.5 high school GPA for consideration.
- ❖ Awarded an additional \$10,000-\$32,000 over four years (\$2,500-\$8,000 per year).
- ❖ Eligible students are invited by the University Scholarship Committee to apply in December.
- ❖ Approximately 14 finalists are selected to interview on campus in February.

Auburn Spirit Foundation Scholarship

- ❖ Requires a minimum 26 ACT or 1170 SAT score and a 3.0 high school GPA for consideration.
- ❖ Additional consideration is given to first generation college students.
- ❖ Recipients may not have been previously recognized by the Office of University Scholarships with a Freshman Scholarship of equal or greater value.
- ❖ Awarded in January at \$6,000 over four year (\$1,500 per year).

Auburn Spirit Foundation Legacy Scholarship

- ❖ Requires a minimum 26 ACT or 1170 SAT score and a 3.0 high school GPA for consideration.
- ❖ Students should indicate on their admissions application if they have a parent or guardian who is an alumnus of Auburn.
- ❖ Recipients may not have been previously recognized by the Office of University Scholarships with a Freshman Scholarship of equal or greater value.
- ❖ Awarded in January at \$6,000 over four year (\$1,500 per year).

Auburn Sponsored Freshman Scholarship

- ❖ America's Junior Miss

General Scholarships

- ❖ Require a minimum 3.0 high school GPA for consideration, with priority consideration given to students with a minimum 28 ACT or 1250 SAT score and a 3.25 high school GPA.
- ❖ Criteria vary, including but not limited to geographic location defined by city, county, or state of residence and/or high school attended; academic achievement; and/or financial need.
- ❖ Eligible students are automatically considered for all General Scholarships for which they meet the criteria.
- ❖ Awarded March to April from \$500 to tuition at an average award amount of \$1,500 for one year.

Departmental Scholarships

- ❖ Each of AU's 12 schools and colleges awards scholarships independent of the scholarships awarded at the university level.
- ❖ Students should contact the school or college and department in which they plan to major for Departmental Scholarship availability and requirements for consideration.
- ❖ Criteria vary, including but not limited to academic major, geographic location, academic achievement, and/or financial need.
- ❖ Awarded March to April from \$500 to \$15,000 at an average award amount of \$2,000 for one year.

Important Notes

- ❖ December 1 is the Freshman Scholarship priority deadline.
- ❖ Students who apply for admission with all admission materials postmarked by this date receive automatic consideration for Freshman and General Scholarships.
- ❖ The application for admission serves as the application for Freshman and General Scholarships. **A separate application is not required.**
- ❖ Minimum academic requirements for scholarship consideration are for students planning to enroll summer or fall 2010 and are subject to change for enrollment in future terms.
- ❖ Tuition scholarship values are based on current tuition rates and will automatically adjust if rates change. For specific tuition scholarship values, go to: www.auburn.edu/scholarship.
- ❖ Students should complete the FAFSA, available online beginning January 1, by March 1 each year to receive consideration for need-based scholarships.
