



## 2010-2011 Resident Freshman Scholarships

### Spirit of Auburn Scholarships

- ❖ A number of four-year, renewable scholarships are automatically awarded at three levels from October to December to Alabama students with a minimum 28 ACT or 1250 SAT score and a 3.25 high school GPA. Students must have the minimum test score and high school GPA required for consideration at each level.
- ❖ **Presidential Scholarship**
  - Requires a 33-36 ACT (1440-1600 SAT) score and a minimum 3.75 high school GPA.
  - Awarded tuition for four years; a \$1,500 technology allowance in the first fall semester; and the Auburn Academic Guarantee, which includes automatic admission to the Honors College and an enrichment experience valued at \$4,000 after the second year.
- ❖ **Founders Scholarship**
  - Requires a 30-32 ACT (1330-1430 SAT) score and a minimum 3.5 high school GPA, or a 33-36 ACT (1440-1600 SAT) score and a 3.50-3.74 high school GPA.
  - Awarded tuition for four years.
- ❖ **University Scholarship**
  - Requires a 28-29 ACT (1250-1320 SAT) score and a minimum 3.25 high school GPA, or a 30-36 ACT (1330-1600 SAT) score and a 3.25-3.49 high school GPA.
  - Awarded \$10,000 over four years (\$2,500 per year).

### National Scholars

- ❖ National Merit Finalists, National Achievement Finalists, and National Hispanic Scholars receive:
  - Spirit of Auburn Presidential Scholarship, replacing a Spirit of Auburn Founders or University Scholarship if previously awarded;
  - On-campus housing allowance for four years; and
  - \$4,000-\$8,000 stipend over four years (\$1,000-\$2,000 per year), depending on eligibility as determined by National Merit Scholarship Corporation and/or financial need as determined through completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- ❖ National Merit Finalists must name AU as their first choice institution with National Merit Scholarship Corporation by their requested deadline(s). National Achievement Finalists and National Hispanic Scholars should mail or fax a copy of their notification letter to the Office of University Scholarships.
- ❖ Alabama National Merit and National Achievement Semifinalists who meet the December 1 Freshman Scholarship priority deadline automatically receive a Spirit of Auburn Founders Scholarship, replacing a Spirit of Auburn University Scholarship if previously awarded.

### Elite Scholarships

- ❖ Require a minimum 34 ACT or 1490 SAT score and a 3.5 high school GPA for consideration.
- ❖ Awarded an additional \$10,000-\$32,000 over four years (\$2,500-\$8,000 per year).
- ❖ Eligible students are invited by the University Scholarship Committee to apply in December.
- ❖ Approximately 14 finalists are selected to interview on campus in February.

### Auburn Spirit Foundation (ASF) and Auburn Spirit Foundation Legacy (ASFL) Scholarships

- ❖ Require a minimum 26 ACT or 1170 SAT score and a 3.0 high school GPA for consideration.
- ❖ Additional consideration is given to first generation college students for ASF Scholarships.
- ❖ Students should indicate on their admissions application if they have a parent or guardian who is an alumnus of Auburn for ASFL Scholarship consideration.

- ❖ Recipients may not have been previously recognized by the Office of University Scholarships with a Freshman Scholarship of equal or greater value.
- ❖ Awarded in January at \$6,000 over four years (\$1,500 per year).

### Advancement Scholarship

- ❖ Alabama students who apply for admission with all admission materials postmarked by the February 1 application for admission deadline receive automatic consideration if they:
  - Have a minimum 3.25 high school GPA; and
  - Reside in a Black Belt county, reside in a county identified by AU's Office of Enrollment Services as an underrepresented county, and/or attend a high school identified by the State of Alabama Department of Education and AU's Office of Enrollment Services as a priority school. - ❖ For eligible high schools and counties that do not have a student with a minimum 3.25 GPA, other students accepted for admission from these high schools and counties will receive consideration.
- ❖ Additional consideration is given to first generation college students and/or those who demonstrate financial need through completion of the FASFA by the March 1 Financial Aid priority deadline.
- ❖ Awarded in March at \$20,000 over four years (\$5,000 per year).

### Achievement and Leadership Scholarships

- ❖ Alabama public and private high schools may nominate:
  - One student who has demonstrated outstanding academic achievement for an Achievement Scholarship; and
  - One student who has demonstrated outstanding leadership within their school and/or community for a Leadership Scholarship.
- ❖ Nominees must have a minimum 24 ACT or 1090 SAT score and a 3.5 high school GPA. High schools that do not have a student with the minimum test score and GPA required for consideration may nominate another student accepted for admission.
- ❖ Nomination forms are mailed to high schools in January with a February 1 priority deadline.
- ❖ Awarded in February at \$6,000 over four years (\$1,500 per year).

- ❖ December 1 is the Freshman Scholarship priority deadline.
- ❖ Students who apply for admission with all admission materials postmarked by this date receive automatic consideration for Freshman and General Scholarships.
- ❖ The application for admission serves as the application for Freshman (excluding Achievement and Leadership) and General Scholarships. **A separate application is not required.**
- ❖ Minimum academic requirements for scholarship consideration are for students planning to enroll summer or fall 2010 and are subject to change for enrollment in future terms.
- ❖ Tuition scholarship values are based on current tuition rates and will automatically adjust if rates change. For specific tuition scholarship values, go to: [www.auburn.edu/scholarship](http://www.auburn.edu/scholarship).
- ❖ Students should complete the FAFSA, available online beginning January 1, by March 1 each year to receive consideration for need-based scholarships.
