BOARD OF TRUSTEES

UNDER THE ORGANIC and statutory laws of Alabama, Auburn University is governed by a Board of Trustees consisting of one member from each congressional district, as these districts were constituted on January 1, 1961, one member from Lee County, two at-large members both of whom shall be a resident of the continental United States, the Governor and the State Superintendent of Education, who are ex-officio. The State Superintendent shall serve until leaving office and will be replaced by one additional at-large member. The Governor is the President. Current trustees are appointed by the Governor, by and with the consent of the State Senate, for a term of 12 years except in the case of the two at-large members, one of whom serves a term of 4 years and the other serves a term of 7 years. Subsequent trustees will be appointed by a committee, by and with the consent of the State Senate, for a term of 7 years, and may serve no more than two full seven-year terms. A member may continue to serve until a successor is confirmed, but in no case for more than one year after a completion of a term. Members of the board receive no compensation. By executive order of the Governor in 1971, a non-voting student representative selected by the Student Senate serves as a member ex-officio.
