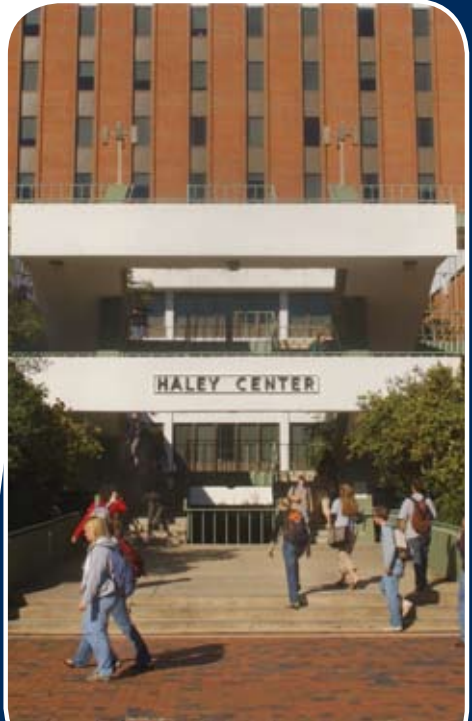

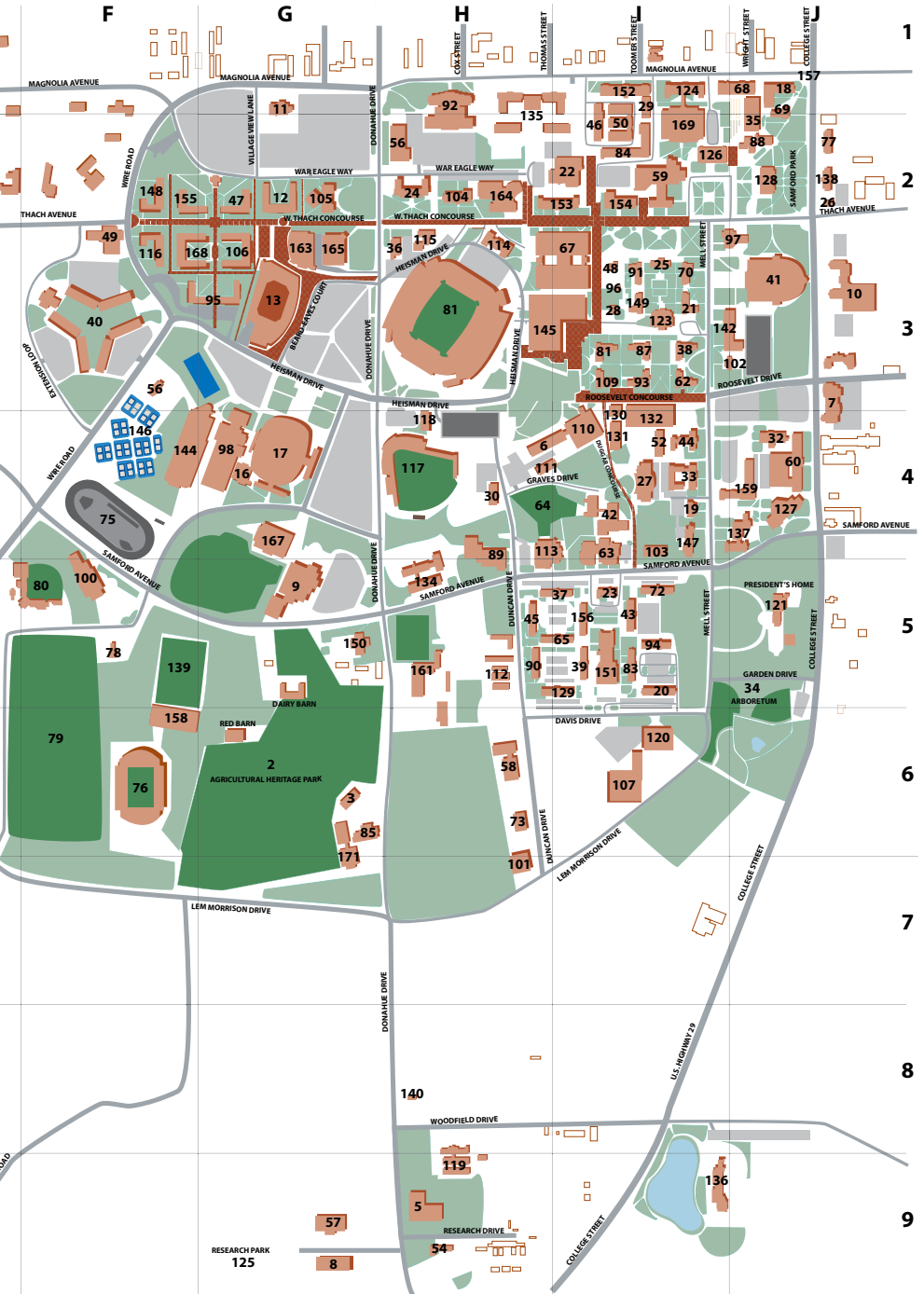

Tiger Transit offers twenty lines for the fall and spring semesters. Twelve lines begin and end at Haley Center; two lines begin and end at Terrell Dining Hall, one line begins and ends at Spidle Hall, one line begins and ends at the stadium deck, and four lines begin and end at the Mell Street Station. Summer transit schedules offer reduced service and are subject to change based on passenger demand.

How do I know which bus line to take?

Each color-coordinated line provides coverage to parts of the AU campus and to outlying Auburn areas. The approximate travel times between points are listed on the schedule. To determine your travel time, add the times from each stop listed between your origin to your destination. Most internal lines have multiple buses running approximately 10-15 minutes apart. Most external lines have multiple buses running approximately 18-45 minutes apart.
