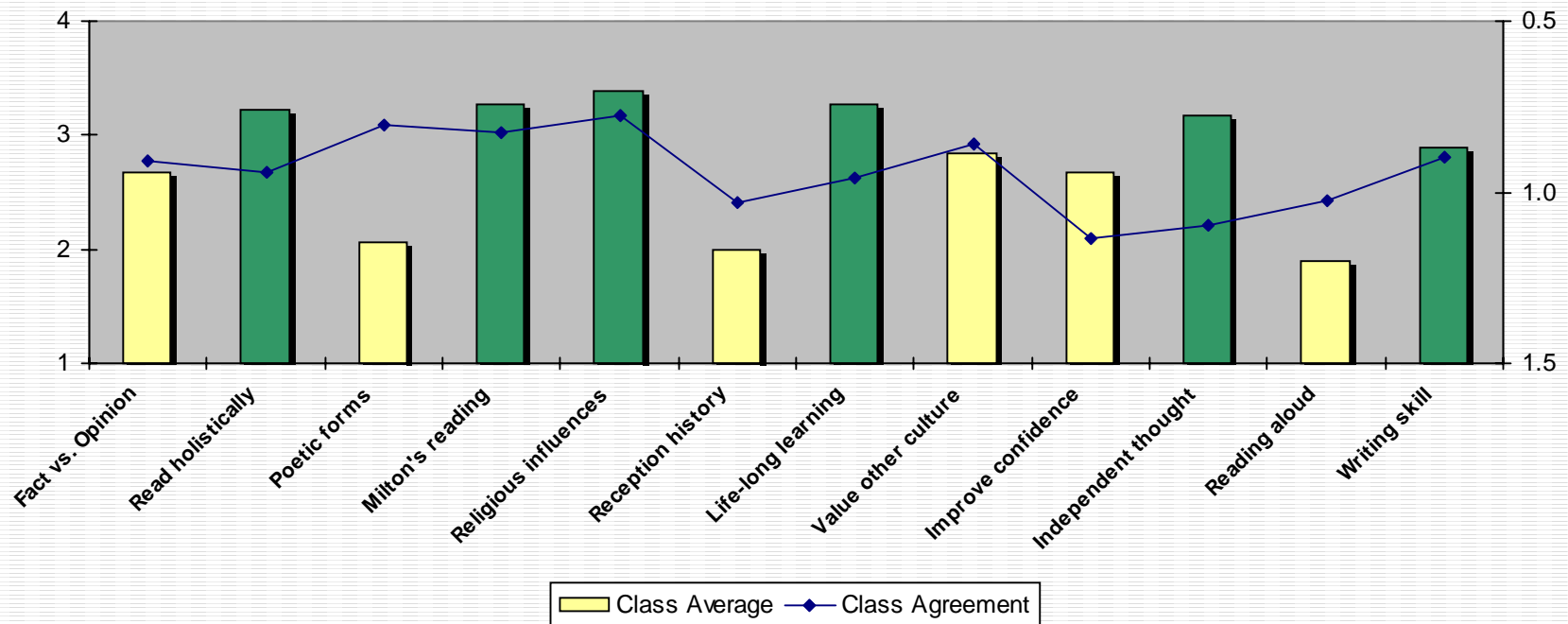

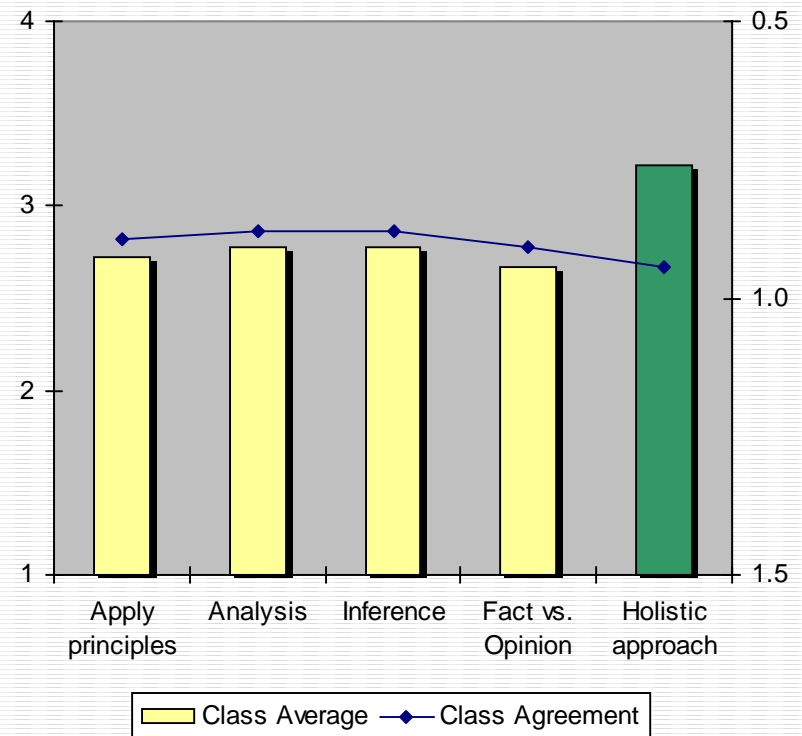


Cluster 1: Complex Cognitive Skills

Goals for Higher-Order Thinking Skills

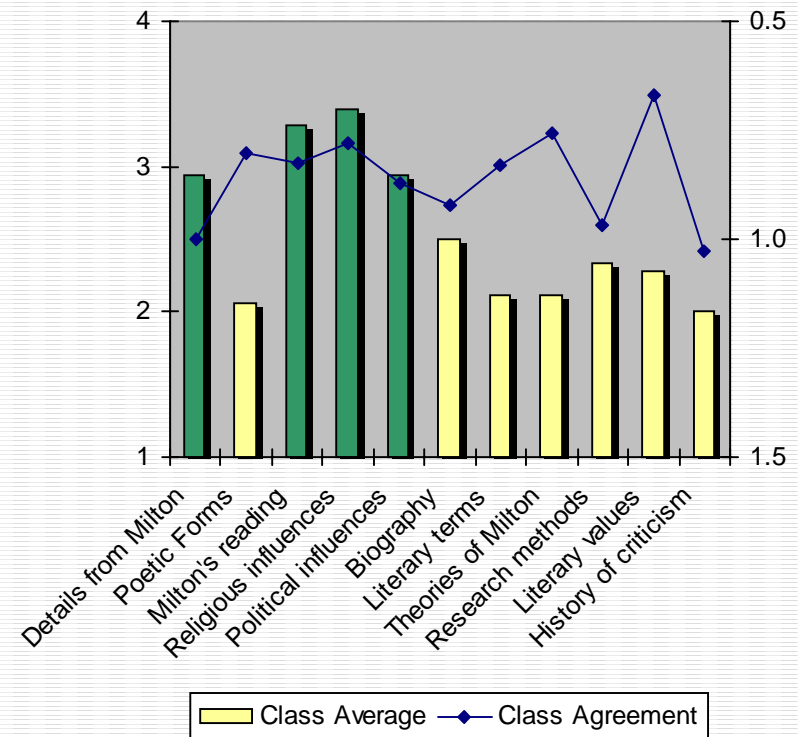


Cluster 2: Subject-Matter Knowledge

- Milton criticism

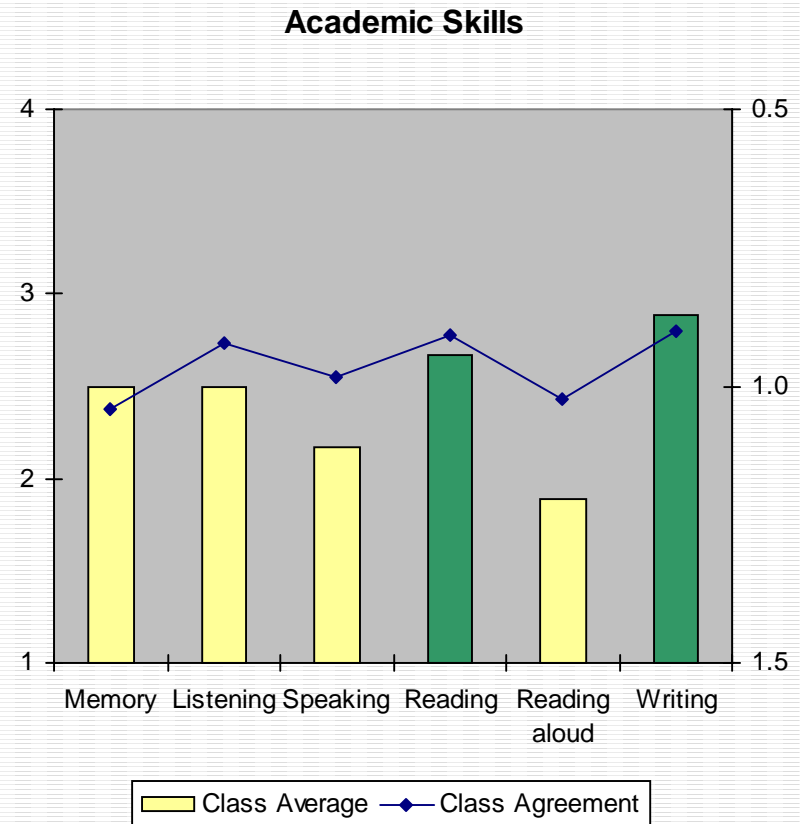

■ Examples

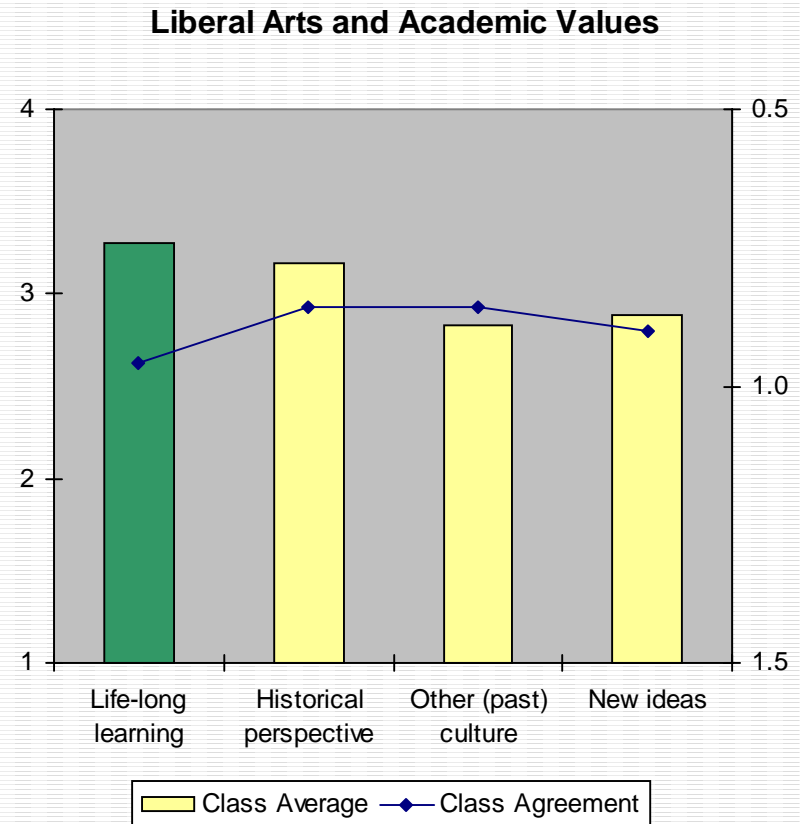
- Memory skill

■ Examples

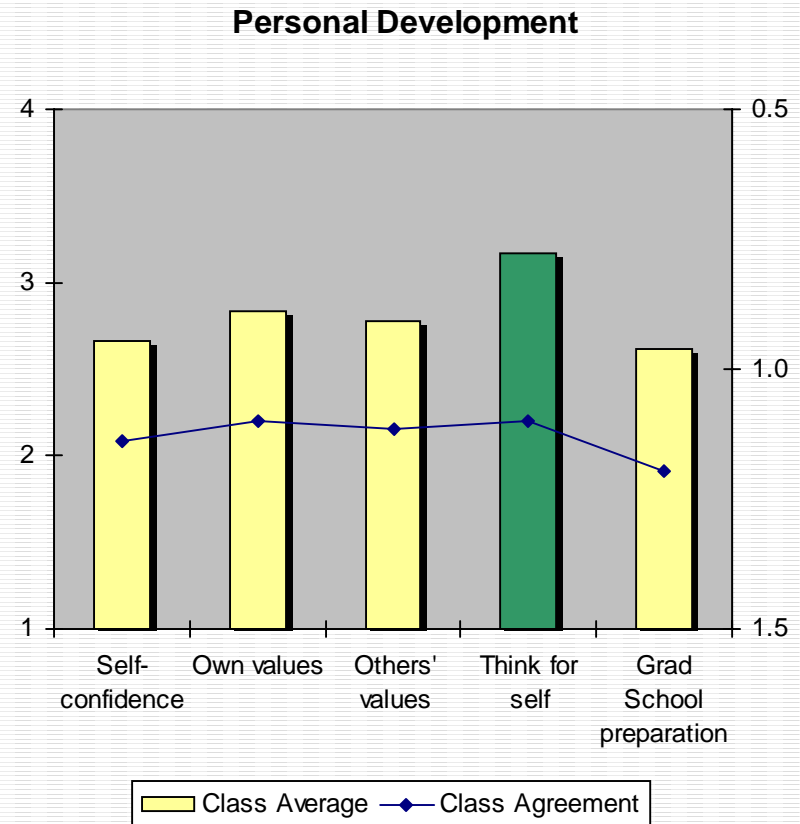
- Lifelong learning
