There will be **NO** makeup exams or quizzes. An unexcused absence from an exam or quiz will result in a grade of zero. In the event of an excused absence from an exam (requiring official documentation as specified in the Tiger Cub), the final exam will be weighted as 50% of the final grade. If you miss one quiz with an excusal, the remaining quizzes will be reweighted accordingly. More than one missed quiz will result in a grade of zero for that quiz, regardless of the reason. Exams or quizzes that have been misgraded may be handed back to me for regrading within 3 days of being returned in class. After 3 days you will lose your right to a regrade. Tests that have been handed back will be regraded in their entirety. Exams may cover any material covered in class and assigned in the text and homework. Quizzes will be given at the beginning of class and may cover any new material up through two days before the given quiz (i.e. a quiz given on a Wednesday may cover any new material up through the lecture of the Monday before).

Homework: Homework problems will be assigned but will not be collected or graded. The solutions to assigned problems will be posted and placed on reserve at the library.

Attendance: Attendance is considered to be mandatory at Auburn University. You are expected to attend all scheduled classes and are responsible for all class announcements and material, including possible changes in exam dates. Attendance and class participation will be considered in assigning borderline grades. If you fail the course and have been absent more than three times during the quarter, your assigned grade will be FA.
