Homework, and Examinations

- **Homework:** Homework will be assigned but will not be collected. Any questions that you may have concerning the homework will be answered in the class.
- **Examinations:** There will be five 50 minute in-class exams and a final examination. Each in-class examination will be worth 14%, and thus all these five in-class examinations will be for a total of 70%. The final examination will be worth 30%, and will be comprehensive.

GRADING POLICY: Your course grade will be determined solely from your examination scores., and will be determined by usual rule, 90-100% for an A, 80-89% for a B, 70-79% for a C, and 60-69% for a D.
