Course Description:

Physical geography seeks to understand the spatial dimensions of the earth's physical systems including the 4 spheres that make up these systems: atmosphere, hydrosphere, lithosphere, and biosphere. The field differs from many other earth sciences in that it places an emphasis on spatial variance and considers humans in this process.

Grading: Standard scale used with following cutoffs; 90 A, 80 B, 70 C, 60 D.

4-5 exams: 80%

Your average exam score will carry a weight of 80% for final course grade. For example, on a scale of 100 points for the total final grade, an average of 90% would be worth 72 points. If you miss an exam it will be very difficult to pass the course.

flex points: 10%

A number of exercises (worksheets/labs, article reviews, presentation reviews, etc.), will be given throughout the semester related to course material. These exercises will help monitor attendance and be used as a learning tool. There will be 2 opportunities for flex extra credit by attending university wide lectures and doing a write-up as explained in class. I will announce opportunities and you are welcome to ask me if there is a lecture you see that you would like to attend that I do not announce.

quizzes: 10%

In class quizzes will be given to help you prepare for examination material. These will be open note and open discussion and will be made up of questions that will be similar to ones that will be on the exams.

Attendance Policies:

- 1) There will be no makeup examinations, quizzes, or flex exercises without prior arrangement or without providing a documented OFFICIAL UNIVERSITY EXCUSE as defined by the Tiger Cub.
 - -This university policy requires that you are to arrange to make up any missed exams, quizzes, or exercises within 5 days.
 - -It is preferred that you correspond (contact and arrange a time and place for a make-up) with me prior to missing a class or at least contact me the day of class. There will be less flexibility for people who do not acknowledge this preference.
