

Peer Mentoring Program Overview and Application (Mentor)

Adjusting to college life at Auburn may be new and challenging. Getting to know new roommates, classmates; adjusting to class schedules and course loads; and the campus may have been overwhelming for you. Finding those people who have had a few years of college experience helped to take away some of that freshman anxiety. Now it's your turn to be that guiding light for someone by becoming a PASS Mentor!

Mission of the PASS Peer Mentoring Program:

The mission of the COSAM peer mentoring program is to **P**romote **A**cademic **S**uccess for **S**tudents (PASS) by providing a healthy learning and social environment. Minority freshmen are paired with upper classmen in their major areas for a smooth transition into college. The program seeks to create a "family away from home" environment to help freshmen reach their academic and social potential at Auburn University.

A mentor is a trusted teacher or counselor. The role a mentor plays in the mentee's undergraduate experience can be beneficial and engaging. The successful mentor exhibits a strong commitment to develop a positive and trusting relationship with his/her mentee.

Role and Responsibilities of a PASS Mentor:

- Commit to mentor at least one student during the academic year
- Attend a Mentor training and orientation
- Attend/Participate in 1-2 on campus events with your mentee
- Attend FSEM meetings with your mentee
- Attend scheduled meetings with Program Coordinators
- Contact mentee at beginning of the semester
- Contact mentee at least once a week via e-mail or in-person scheduled activities
- Meet with mentee at least once a month
- Document meetings and mentee's progress each semester
- Complete program evaluation

Mentor Requirements:

- Junior (61 hours), Senior (91 hours), or a graduate student classification
- All COSAM Scholars of Junior and Senior status are required to participate
- 2.5 cumulative GPA or above
- Personable, flexible, and considerate of the other student's needs
- Knowledgeable of the AU campus and/or the community
- Committed to the ideals, time commitment, and mission of the PASS Program

Benefits of being a PASS Mentor:

- An opportunity to help provide a healthy and positive environment for freshmen
- An opportunity to build your resume and establish references
- An opportunity to build networks, develop professional leadership, and enhance organizational skills
