AREA V – Pre-professional, major, & elective courses The industrial design major requires both studio & professional support courses to complete the bachelor’s degree. Since these courses are not taught at the community college level, courses taken beyond the 42 semester hours listed in AREAS I-IV above will count only as free electives outside of the major and are not degree applicable.	Reverse Transfer Needs <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students who transfer before completing their AA/AS degree are encouraged to complete the Reverse Transfer Process. • The required math for your chosen major is Finite Math (MTH 110) or higher. If you have not taken a math course before transferring, you will be required to take the ALEKS Math Placement assessment before you can register for any math course at Auburn. The math course you are able to begin at Auburn is determined by either a) the highest equivalent math you have passed before transferring or b) the math placement results from the ALEKS assessment which is available in AU Access once you have paid your AU admissions deposit.

¹This major requires Technology & Civilization (HIST 1210 & 1220). Students will be required to take this course sequence to complete the bachelor’s degree requirements, regardless of other completed history courses. Please contact us for more information.

Notes: The recommended start term for INDD majors is summer. Please note this summer semester is the beginning of a competitive selection process. If selected, students can expect to complete a 7-semester sequence of studio courses after transferring.
