LAAB requires that programs graduate one class of students before performing its initial accreditation review. With the Fall 2021 launch of Auburn's Undergraduate Program in Landscape Architecture, the program will be eligible for the initial accreditation review in 2025-26. The Undergraduate Program is also scheduled to have its candidacy visit from LAAB in spring 2024. The candidacy visit precedes and prepares for the initial accreditation review. Until the program is reviewed for accreditation in 2025-26, we are not able to make the final determination that your degree will meet the educational requirements of licensure. As a point of context, Auburn's Graduate Program in Landscape Architecture has been accredited since its inception and we are optimistic that our efforts in the Undergraduate Program will result in the same outcome. If the program is successful in its pursuit of accreditation in the 2025-2026 academic year, then accreditation will apply to any 2024 or 2025 graduates as well. Once we earn accreditation, we anticipate our program will meet the licensure requirements in most states.</p>
