JOB SUMMARY

Reporting to the Executive Director of the Jay and Susie Gogue Performing Arts Center, the Director of Production provides strategic leadership for production, technical operations, facilities coordination, and venue readiness across GPAC's multi-venue performing arts center. This position is responsible for planning, organizing, and directing production resources, technical systems, staffing, facility-related support, and event-readiness standards for professional presentations, university events, community programs, rentals, and other GPAC activities. The Director works collaboratively with GPAC departments and Auburn University partners to ensure performances and events are produced safely, efficiently, and in alignment with GPAC's artistic, operational, and institutional goals.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Directs the planning, organization, and implementation of production and technical services for professional presentations, university events, community programs, rentals, and other GPAC activities, ensuring appropriate staffing, equipment, scheduling, and technical support.
- Coordinates facility-related needs that support performances, events, and daily venue readiness, including maintenance and repair communication, custodial coordination, security, police, fire/life safety support, and other operational requirements in collaboration with Auburn University departments and external partners.
- Oversees production standards, technical systems, stage operations, equipment use, load-in and load-out procedures, rehearsal support, performance support, and related production processes to ensure safe, efficient, and high-quality execution.
- Collaborates with the Executive Director, GPAC and Managing Director, GPAC to develop short-term and long-term goals for production operations, facility readiness, technical infrastructure, staffing, capital equipment, and overall venue support.
- Works with internal and external constituents to assess technical requirements, production schedules, facility needs, equipment needs, labor requirements, safety considerations, and event timelines for GPAC presentations, university events, community programs, rentals, and other activities.
- Coordinates with GPAC departments to ensure production and facility-related needs are communicated, planned, staffed, evaluated, and continuously improved.
- Supervises assigned full-time, part-time, student, TES, production, technical, stage operations, and contracted labor staff; coordinates with the Executive Director, GPAC, and GPAC departments to ensure production services, technical support, facility readiness, and venue support needs are communicated, staffed, evaluated, and continuously improved.

The responsibilities listed above show the typical duties for jobs in this classification. Actual tasks may differ depending on the department's needs. Other similar duties may be assigned with discretion of the supervisor. Not every duty will apply to every position, and the amount of time spent on each task can change based on department needs.
