JOB SUMMARY

The Director of Campus and Community Relations at the Jay and Susie Gogue Performing Arts Center (GPAC) at Auburn University, reporting to the Executive Director, GPAC, leads efforts to build and sustain relationships with Auburn University departments, campus partners, community organizations, civic partners, schools, businesses, and external clients. This position advances campus and community partnerships, supports assigned programs, and generates earned revenue through venue rentals. The Director supervises the Campus and Community Programs Coordinator and the Coordinator of Venue Sales and Rentals, aligning partnerships, program coordination, client cultivation, and rental revenue with GPAC's mission and long-term sustainability.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Develops, implements, and oversees strategic initiatives that strengthen GPAC's relationships with Auburn University, local and regional communities, schools, nonprofit organizations, civic partners, businesses, and other external stakeholders.
- Develops and sustains partnerships with Auburn University faculty, staff, students, colleges, departments, and campus organizations to integrate GPAC resources into academic, co-curricular, student, and institutional programs.
- Builds and maintains relationships with community organizations, nonprofits, civic partners, and businesses to support collaborative programming, public participation, and expanded GPAC reach throughout the region and state.
- Provides leadership and oversight for assigned venue rentals, including proactive sales strategies, client cultivation, rental inquiry management, accurate rental agreements, and customer service standards that support organizational revenue goals.
- Collaborates with internal GPAC teams, including Programming, Production, Patron Services, Communications and Marketing, and Administration, to ensure successful planning, communication, and delivery of campus programs, community programs, partnership activities, and rental events.
- Tracks participation, partnership activity, rental inquiries, confirmed rentals, revenue performance, and other departmental metrics. Prepares reports to assess impact, identify growth opportunities, and support data-informed planning.
- Represents GPAC at campus, community, and civic meetings; identifies and supports grant applications and reports; and contributes to long-term strategies that expand GPAC's role as a hub for campus collaboration, community connection, arts participation, and rental revenue generation.
- Supervises assigned full-time, student, and program support staff; coordinates with the Executive Director, GPAC, and GPAC departments to ensure campus programs, community programs, partnerships, and assigned rental activities are communicated, staffed, evaluated, and continuously improved.

The responsibilities listed above show the typical duties for jobs in this classification. Actual tasks may differ depending on the department's needs. Other similar duties may be assigned with discretion of the supervisor. Not every duty will apply to every position, and the amount of time spent on each task can change based on department needs.
