JOB SUMMARY

The Assistant Coach of Adaptive Athletics or Programs supports the daily operations of the Adaptive Athletics program and contribute to coaching activities.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assists in the planning, development, and direction of all team training and conditioning activities.
- Assists in preparation and implementation of scouting reports, game for the Adaptive Athletics.
- Assists with the wheelchair basketball operations under the supervision of the Head Coach.
- Coordinates team travel, room reservations (on and off campus), and meals.
- Provides instruction in technique and safety procedures in adherence with NWBA regulations.
- Serves as game day manager. Assists with all event responsibilities including set up and take down and overseeing events. Initiates contact with all visiting athletic teams to identify game-day needs. Coordinates the set up and take down for home Adaptive Athletics events.
- Implements and organizes Adaptive Athletics student athlete services. Partners with campus community and coaching staff in providing academic services for student athletes.
