JOB SUMMARY

Reporting to the Senior Associate Athletics Director of Fan Experience & Creative, the Associate Athletics Director (AD) of War Eagle Productions oversees the overall operations of the three units within the War Eagle Productions team which includes Live Broadcast, Videoboard Operations, and Broadcast & Network Systems.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Oversees the overall operations of the three units within the War Eagle Productions team, including Live Broadcast, Videoboard Operations, and Broadcast & Network Systems. Live Broadcasts include SEC Network broadcasts and other various live operations within the War Eagle Productions control room. Videoboard Operations include the operations of video boards within Jordan-Hare Stadium, Neville Arena, Plainsman Park, Auburn Soccer Complex, Jane B. Moore Field, James E. Martin Aquatic Center, and Auburn University Equestrian Center. Broadcast & Network Systems includes a team of broadcast engineers who manage broadcast equipment and hardware within a broadcast control room.
- Oversees external partnerships and contract management within technology partnerships utilized by Auburn Athletics which include Auburn audiovisual (AV) and Daktronics.
- Leads the daily activities of the War Eagle Productions team and assumes responsibility for all facets of the team's operations, including fostering innovation and upholding the team's status as a leader in live production.
- Exhibits a culture of collaboration between War Eagle Creative, Fan Experience, and War Eagle Productions units to maximize the experience for student-athletes, fans, alumni, and students.
- Establishes, cultivates, manages, and maintains effective working relationships with ESPN/SEC Network, Auburn Sports Properties, and other departments both outside of and within Athletics, which includes campus partnerships.
- Oversees and manages the annual operations budget within War Eagle Productions. Responsible for forecasted spending and management of deferred maintenance.
- Oversees revenue generation and revenue streams that fall within War Eagle Productions' purview.
- Oversees all HR responsibilities within War Eagle Productions, which includes payroll, creation of job descriptions, hirings, and the onboarding and offboarding of full-time and part-time employees.
- Develops and implements strategies for War Eagle Productions' role within the external landscape of Auburn Athletics
- Manages and oversees the creation, deployment, and updates to the WEP organizational structure, policies, and procedures.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Complies with all applicable National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) and Southeastern Conference (SEC) regulations in the performance of job duties.
