JOB SUMMARY

Provides oversight for new and existing gameday technologies within the Athletics Department's venues and under the purview of the Senior Associate AD, Fan Experience & Creative Strategy. Reporting directly to the Associate AD, War Eagle Productions, this role will also oversee the operation of audio-visual production for Athletics' special events outside of and within Auburn Athletics venues.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Oversees new and existing gameday technologies within the Athletics Department's venues that lie under the purview of the Sr. Associate AD, Fan Experience & Creative Strategy.
- Supervises a select staff of full-time War Eagle Production personnel, which could include videoboard and AV production team members.
- Oversees the operation and maintenance of all videoboards, timing, and scoring systems, but not limited to, Daktronics video, scoring, and timing systems.
- Oversees the programming of in-venue RGB lighting (Musco), and the installation, programming, and maintenance of in-venue specialty and intelligent lighting.
- Oversees the operation and maintenance of in-venue audio systems within, but not limited to, Jordan-Hare Stadium, Neville Arena, and Plainsman Park.
- Oversees the installation and technical operation of new gameday technologies within athletics venues.
- Oversees the operation and management of Athletics' special events audio-visual production needs.
- Recruits, trains, and supervises a team of students and/or professional freelancers for the execution of audio-visual production needs.
- Assists with the budgeting, quoting, invoicing, rate setting, and financial operation of the production of special events. Assists with the management and budgeting of the Daktronics service contract.
- Acts as the point of contact to all in-venue audio-visual Special Events-related third-party vendors.
- Exhibits a culture of collaboration between War Eagle Productions, War Eagle Creative, and Fan Experience units to maximize the experience for student athletes, fans, alumni, and students. Provides support to War Eagle Productions, Fan Experience, and Community Relations units to achieve maximum output of high-level productions and engagement.
- Complies with all applicable National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) and Southeastern Conference (SEC) regulations in the performance of job duties.
- May perform other duties as assigned.
