JOB SUMMARY

Manages, supervises, and oversees the daily operations of the Raptor Rehabilitation Unit of the Southeastern Raptor Center (SRC).

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Manages, coordinates, and oversees rehabilitative care services rendered at the rehabilitation hospital and assists with medical care and examinations of raptors in rehabilitative and educational units under the direction of the veterinary staff.
- Coordinates necessary administrative functions related to the Rehabilitation Unit.
- Manages and coordinates the work assignments and activities of staff, student workers, and volunteers.
- Manages and supervises the recruitment of volunteers for the Rehabilitation Unit.
- Oversees and ensures proper maintenance of rehabilitation facilities, equipment, and falconry equipment.
- Communicates with state and federal wildlife agencies and SRC personnel on matters relating to various professional association requirements and policies.
- Participates in lectures, presentations, programs, and research efforts relating to the SRC.
- Promotes the SRC, CVM, and AU through various public relations activities and assists with SRC marketing efforts.
