JOB SUMMARY

Under general supervision, the Canine Instructor II performs canine development, training and handling in operations to support research and development activities in the Canine Performance Sciences Program. Provides general care and welfare of canines, maintains equipment and facilities, participates in outreach activities, and other duties as assigned to support the program's mission. Contributes to planning and design of training and research protocols. Performs immediate supervision of development, training and research activities. Performs training and outreach activities.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Performs canine development, training and handling to support detection dog production and research, development, and outreach activities.
- Observes, records, and assists in evaluating canine behavior and performance for production, research, and development activities.
- Assists in planning, design and supervision of training, research, development and outreach activities.
- Maintains equipment and facilities.
- Identifies and assists in enhancing canine performance.

The responsibilities listed above show the typical duties for jobs in this classification. Actual tasks may differ depending on the department's needs. Other similar duties may be assigned with discretion of the supervisor. Not every duty will apply to every position, and the amount of time spent on each task can change based on department needs.
