JOB SUMMARY

Coordinates and oversees on-site technical advice to students regarding construction details and building techniques required for building projects as well as overseeing the Rural Studio wood shop and tool inventory.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Instructs and monitors students and faculty in safe and proper operation of shop equipment and tools ensuring proper safety guidelines are followed.
- Maintains and repairs shop equipment and on-site tools ensuring they are maintained in proper safe working order.
- Provides instruction to students relative to using shop equipment to complete class/studio assignments.
- Prepares curriculum and course plans for assigned classes.
- Works with the Rural Studio faculty, students, and community partners to plan, organize, review designs and coordinate small, community-based renovation and repair projects.
- Performs architectural design functions by working drawings, and specifications for projects.
- Orders replacement parts and equipment as required.

The responsibilities listed above show the typical duties for jobs in this classification. Actual tasks may differ depending on the department's needs. Other similar duties may be assigned with discretion of the supervisor. Not every duty will apply to every position, and the amount of time spent on each task can change based on department needs.
