

Auburn University Assistant Vice President for Enrollment Management and Executive Director of Undergraduate Admissions

Auburn University, a premier land-grant and R1 university, seeks a talented and experienced admissions professional to serve as its next [Assistant Vice President \(AVP\) for Enrollment Management and Executive Director of Undergraduate Admissions](#).

Reporting to the Vice President of Enrollment Management, the AVP will be the university's senior admissions officer and will manage a staff of 49 while being responsible for recruiting, selecting, and yielding, first-year and transfer students in alignment with strategic enrollment goals. The AVP will serve as a member of the Enrollment Management Council for Auburn University and will assist in managing and executing enrollment marketing efforts including external search campaigns and new marketing collateral. The successful candidate must be able to demonstrate superior leadership skills, contributing effectively to academic excellence, diversity and quality improvement.

The AVP will collaborate closely with campus partners to determine and implement policies and strategies meeting the university's enrollment objectives. The AVP will also be tasked with developing systems, structures and strategies designed to enhance the market position and profile of the institution, while also working closely with the surrounding Auburn community to build effective relationships.

Auburn University is nationally recognized for its commitment to academic excellence, positive work environment, student engagement, and beautiful campus. Auburn is organized into 12 academic colleges, offering more than 150 educational programs, and has an enrollment of more than 31,000 students comprised of approximately 25,000 undergraduates and nearly 6,500 graduate and professional students. Situated along the rapidly developing I-85 corridor between Atlanta, Georgia, and Montgomery, Alabama, the combined Auburn-Opelika, Alabama/Columbus, Georgia statistical areas have a population of over 500,000, with excellent public-school systems, outstanding recreation areas and an exceptional regional medical center. Auburn residents enjoy a thriving community, and the city is recognized as one of the best-performing small cities in the U.S. by the Milken Institute and in Livability's Top 100 Best Places to Live. It features a moderate southern climate and easy access to large cities, beaches, and recreational mountain venues.

A master's degree in Higher Education Administration, Educational Administration, Communications or a related field is required, as are ten years of experience in admissions.
